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What is this product?

Type

This product is a share of an investment company qualifying as an undertaking for collective investments in transferable securities (UCITS).

Term

This sub-fund has no maturity date. However, the manufacturer may decide to close the sub-fund under certain circumstances.

Objectives

The objective of the Compartment is to offer investors fixed income portfolio returns, mainly through exposure to investment grade global corporate issuers with moderate duration exposure while integrating environmental, social and governance ("ESG") considerations. The Compartment takes ESG characteristics into account as part of its selection process. In that respect, the Compartment promotes environmental and/or social characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. For the assessment, areas like corporate strategy, corporate governance, transparency and the product and service range of a company are taken into account in the investment process and strategy. The Compartment offers exposure mainly to investment grade fixed income securities issued by companies domiciled in Developed Markets and/or companies which have the preponderance of their business activities in Developed Markets. The Compartment will combine a top-down and a bottom-up approach. The top-down approach is based on an analysis of macro-economic variables to define the interest rates curve exposure and overall duration exposure of the Compartment.

Intended Investors

This Share Class is intended for prudent investors intending above all to preserve the invested capital while taking part in the opportunities for growth of the financial markets.

Other information

Depository bank: CACEIS Bank, Luxembourg branch.

Class type: this class is a capitalization class meaning that income is reinvested.

Conversion right: the investor has the right to convert his investment in shares in one sub-fund for shares in the same sub-fund or in another sub-fund. The investor can obtain information about how to convert in the prospectus of the fund.

Segregation: The assets and liabilities of a sub-fund are segregated pursuant to the law so that the commitments and liabilities of one sub-fund do not affect the other sub-funds.

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation or guarantee scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, the depository CACEIS Bank, Luxembourg Branch. Should we default, the investments are liquidated, and the proceeds are distributed to the investors. In the worst case, however, you could lose your entire investment.
